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## FEATURED PAGA PROFILE **C** Barangay Sagad Fire Volunteer

I am Jericho R. Ignacio, a fire volunteer at Brgy. Sagad fire and rescue. I have wanted to be a firefighter since I was in Grade school.

It started when I was in Elementary school every time I heard the fire siren, instead of being afraid like other kids, I was feeling excited and amazed. Whenever a fire truck passes by, I will definitely stop just to look at them. So, when PAGA had a medical mission years back, I got excited because I saw BFP personnel and observed what they were doing. After an incident where I happened to help a PWD who fell from his bike and hit his head, I assisted him until the ambulance and medics arrived, I told myself and realized how happy I am helping other people, I decided that I want to be one of the Fire Volunteers in our Barangay.

During my Senior High school, I met someone, a long-time Fire volunteer who inspired me to pursue my interest. So in the first week of July 2019, one of my friends asked me if I wanted to come with him because he was going to apply as a Fire Volunteer. My mother talked to the BDRRMO Chief of our Barangay, and he replied that we are qualified to be a Fire Volunteer. On the first day, we went to the Sagad Fire and Rescue base and they taught us what tools inside that we are going to use. They also taught us about the Fire Truck and the strategy for hose rolls. After that, I realized that one of my dreams already happened; to be one of the Fire Volunteers in our Barangay.

On July 13, 2019, I attended the BASIC FIRE FIGHTING TRAINING, later called a SAGAD PROBLE 10. Since then, we have always been involved in responding to fire situations. The first fire I went to was on November 2, 2019, in Brgy. Cembo, Makati City. Since then, we've responded to many fire incidents in cities of Metro-Manila; and with each response, I have gained a lot of knowledge on fire strategies and experiences. Right now, I am trying my best to become a regular member, be given a 'call sign' which when given, is an achievement as a fire volunteer. I will also try to learn how to be a first aider inside an ambulance.

I'm happy to be a Firefighter/Volunteer even though it's a risk on our life. Because we help people, we save lives and properties, and, we keep them safe. But when people thank us, all of our tiredness disappears, we're happy that they appreciate our efforts to save their lives and properties. Being a Fire Volunteer/Fire Fighter is a huge responsibility, you've to do it with all your heart.

Again, I am Jericho Ignacio a beneficiary of the Philippine American Guardian Association and also a Fire Volunteer.
