The Philippine American Guardian Association Annual President's Update - 2022

Dear Members, Donors, and Friends,

As you probably know all too well, 2022 was a year of recovery from some of the worst restrictions imposed during the COVID-19 pandemic. The cessation of face-to-face classes in the public school system, beginning in 2020, was one of the longest 'lockdowns' worldwide. This resulted in major learning losses across the country's K-12 classrooms.

Fortunately, as of last November, 94% of the public schools in the National Capital Region have resumed five-day in-person classes, after more than two years since the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic. This is very good news because PAGA's beneficiaries are located in the NCR and 2 adjacent regions. Other more remote regions are struggling to repair and upgrade classrooms and infrastructure.

Despite the longstanding restrictions, the PAGA team continued innovating and providing new and timetested content and services to our beneficiaries via Zoom and other online platforms, such as:

- A total of 58 students, parents, and guardians attended webinars on Financial Literacy
- Leadership Training: The 7 Habits of Highly Effective Teens (to be scheduled)
- A stress management workshop for students (to be scheduled)

61 beneficiaries enrolled in school (across all grades) - services provided include:

- School supplies for 61 students; distributed in Mar 2022 and Aug 2022 (Balik Eskwela)
- Prepaid data load 67 students were provided in Jan & Feb 2022 for online classes.
- Provision of Tablet PC's 5 students (4- JHS; 1 SHS)
- Tuition Fee- 1 student
- Monthly Educational Incentive Allowance @ 1000 each for 10 months 67 students
- Graduating Students provided prepaid load as graduation incentive @ 200 each.
- Graduation Fees- 3 SHS @ P1000 each, 1 Elementary- P500

Graduations:

- Four college students graduated (B.S. in Tourism Management, B.S. in Economics, B.S. in Aircraft Maintenance Technology, B.S. in Information Technology).
- Nine Senior High School graduated (3 with High Honors)
- Five Junior High School Completers
- Three Elementary graduates (1 with High Honors)

Health care & food assistance:

- 61 families each received P1,000 worth of health and essential item vouchers (Mercury Drug Certificates)
- 20 selected families received P3000 emergency food support.
- 1 parent received diabetes and hypertension medication through Master Choa Kok
 Foundation
- Cash assistance provided for a beneficiary's hospitalization due to a cycling accident.

Psycho-Social development:

41 beneficiaries participated in the Team Building and Balik Eskwela activity with a theme:
 "New Season. Letting Go, Moving Forward, Enjoy, Learn and Engage" conducted in three areas of NCR, Angeles, and Bulacan in the month of August 2022

Donors: an important topic as donations are a critical component of our budget:

- We were pleased to receive USD\$9,000 from 16 donors on the GlobalGiving website.

As you can see, our PAGA team was very busy helping our beneficiaries navigate the continuously changing restrictions and protocols of the pandemic. We'll continue to do this, augmenting the provisions of the Government social welfare programs where needed.

Let's hope for further improvements in the recovery of our educational system so our students can more readily attain their career goals without interruption.

OUR WORK: HIGHLIGHTS OF THE FISCAL YEAR 2021-2022

EDUCATION PROGRAM

Assisted sixty-one (61) enrolled students in education thru the provision of school supplies, prepaid data load, tablet PCs, school fee assistance, and monthly incentive allowance.

FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS FISCAL YEAR 2021-2022

PAGA as an NGO relies upon the support and contribution of its members and donors (individuals and groups) who believe in its mission.



For the FY 2021-2022, a total cash contribution of P1.766M was received with none for non-cash donation.

Total expenses for FY ending September 2022 were P3,507M with P2,566.M for welfare programs; P940,987 for general administrative costs.
